We believe that the pronunciation of the Name אוושע is "Yahshua" or Yah-shua.

We follow the Triennial Torah Cycle which is the same Torah cycle that Yahshua followed.

We post the monthly reading list on our website.

Restoration Ministries is a First Amendment religious association.

We have not sought government permission to exist.

We are submissive to Yahweh's Torah and we teach submission to Yahweh's Torah.

We believe that we are Hebrews or "called out ones".

Restoration Ministries will conduct regular Shabbat services every Shabbat in the Crossville area at the command of Yahweh.

We are actively seeking a permanent location.
